PARENTS

This packet is all the information you need for camp:

- All campers will be expected to follow the attached rules & dress code.
- All campers MUST have a camper information and release form filled out and signed by the parent or guardian before camp.
- The cost per camper is \$135 for 1st grade and older, \$62.50 for children age 3 to entering kindergarten and no charge for age 2 and younger

CAMP RULES

ALL campers must obey ALL counselors and the rules listed below.

- Counselors MUST be 21 years of age. <u>Campers must be 9 years old to</u> attend without a parent or guardian <u>attending with them</u>. 1 adult male for every 10 boys. 1 adult female for every 10 girls.
- 3. Parents or guardians must sign camper information and release form
- 4. In the case of an accident, illness, or emergency, campers are required to report to the camp nurse.
- 5. No one shall go beyond camp boundaries without permission from the camp director.
- 6. Each person is expected to help keep their cabin and the campground clean.
- 7. Each camper must attend all classes, meals, and recreational activities unless excused by the camp director.
- 8. Complete Reverence (Respect) is expected at every worship service.
- ALL campers must be in bed and quiet after the lights are turned out. (Counseling will be permitted in the tabernacle after "lights out" if deemed necessary by the camp director.)
- 10. Use of cell phones will be limited to FREE TIME ONLY. PLEASE DO NOT BRING CELL PHONES TO THE WORSHIP SERVICES.

URGENT HEALTH ISSUES

Dear Counselors and Parents:

StoneRidge Camp focuses on helping each camper know and grow in Jesus Christ. While our focus is spiritual when there are several hundred campers at StoneRidge we must also deal with physical problems as well and we need your help to deal with one issue in particular: lice.

While we do want our kids itching to come to camp, we don't want them itching when they get to camp. In past years, we have had a few campers come to StoneRidge Camp with cases of head lice. While those campers were required to leave camp as soon as this condition was known, it only takes one instance of contact to spread lice to someone else. Therefore, we need your help to keep any cases of lice from arriving at camp in the first place. Please help us by inspecting or having someone inspect each of your campers for lice BEFORE they come to camp. While this might be a little awkward to do so, it will be much less awkward than having to bring them home before camp ends. Thank you for helping us with this issue so that our Church Camp will be a great experience for everyone.

DRESS CODE

At camp, we're all about respect and letting everyone be themselves, while still keeping things modest when it comes to what we wear. These guidelines are here to help make sure everyone feels comfortable and included. We ask that campers dress modestly at all times—here's what that looks like:"

- Students and adults are not allowed to wear clothing that shows their stomach, tank tops, see-through shirts, sleeveless or spaghetti strap sundresses.
- Shirts should be long enough to cover your stomach completely, even when you're sitting or being active.
- All shirts must have sleeves, i.e., <u>no tank</u> tops.
- Low-cut tops that expose cleavage are not allowed.
- Shorts are permitted to the fingertip length.
- Jeans, pants, and leggings are permitted for all campers as long as they are modest and worn comfortably at the waist.
- Clothing with excessive rips or rips in inappropriate places is not acceptable.
- No clothing of any type bearing offensive language, or images, whether implied or directly stated, will be worn.
- Clothes with secular themes such as alcoholic beverages, music, tobacco, etc, will not be worn.
- No writing on the buttocks of clothing.

Evening Services

 Dress shorts are permitted as well as dresses (at the knee) for the evening services.

SWIMWEAR

- No bikini swimsuits are allowed. Tankini suits are permissible.
- A T-shirt or swim cover-up is required for both boys and girls
- Females: The cover-up needs to totally cover the swimsuit and not be see thru or fish net.
- Towels wrapped around the body DOES NOT count as a cover-up.
- Separate swim times will be observed for boys and girls.
- Boys are not to congregate around the pool area while the girls are swimming.
- Girls are not to congregate around the pool area while the boys are swimming.

Helpful Packing Tips

Pack with your child

Packing with your child is a great way to build excitement about camp and also a great way to talk through any worries or anxieties your child may have about their time away at camp. In addition, it gives you the opportunity to make sure that they pack everything they need to bring, and leave home the stuff that should stay at home. It also helps the child to know where in their bag or suitcase all of their items are located.

Send a checklist for your child to help them on Friday morning

You can use the same checklist that you used when you packed. Pack the checklist in your child's luggage and instruct them to use it when they pack up to come home. This will help your child leave with everything they came with.

What to pack your stuff in

Pack your stuff in something that you can carry a short distance from the Parking Area to the cabins. A duffel bag or suitcase is fine. Pillows, bedding, and sleeping bags do great in large plastic trash bags (make sure you put a label on the trash bag so that we know who it belongs to).

Label everything you can

Put your child's first and last name on everything you can with a permanent marker. Be sure to label your child's luggage. If your child loses something (and they usually do) it will turn up in Lost and Found. Having a name on the items makes it much simpler to return them to your child. Every year at camp there are many towels and items of clothing that get left behind at camp. A name on these items can help make sure everything makes it home.

Pack appropriate attire for camp

Pack clothing that is comfortable in hot Arkansas weather, suitable for outdoor games, and can get wet and/or dirty without being ruined. Please pack nicer clothes for the evening worship service. Campers should not pack clothing that promotes alcohol, tobacco, drug use, sexual behavior, or contains inappropriate language. As a Christian camp, we expect a high standard of conduct and dress. Please, no spaghetti straps, bare midriffs, or improper slogans. Shorts should be modest (not too tight, too high, or too low), and bathing suits should be one-piece and modest. We reserve the right to ask campers to change improper clothing.

About Swimsuits

We require that female staff and campers wear modest one-piece suits while at camp (modest tankinis are acceptable), and that male campers wear swim trunks or board shorts.

Medications

All medications (prescription, non-prescription, and over-the-counter) remain with and are dispensed by the adult counselors who will accompany your kids. Please coordinate with them before camp.
